1. Executive Summary

This report contains an overview of the activities the UNESCO Chair on Bioethics UGM (which will be referred as 'the Chair' from hereafter) designed and carried out in the period of October 2020 - December 2021. In general, the Chair's programs consist of 4 areas: (1) Bioethics in Higher Education; (2) Bioethics in Research; (3) Bioethics for the Community; and (4) Bioethics Institutional Sustainability. Each of these areas comprise several different activities as follows:

1. Bioethics in Higher Education

This area overall aims to accelerate the growth of Bioethics education in higher education, through integrated Bioethics education and across disciplines at UGM, and the Bioethics master program UGM expansion to international level. Some of the proposed programmes that are under this area are:

- a) Scientific Bioethics Discussion
- b) Massive Open Online Course
- c) Bioethics Modules & Textbook Development
- d) Visiting Professorship
- 2. Bioethics in Research

This area aims to advance the application of ethical research conduct in various fields of study, starting from UGM and responding to the needs at the national level.

3. Bioethics for the Community

This area aims to foster community empowerment and public awareness on Bioethics issues as well as enable public accessibility to ethics support and services through the following activities:

- a) Ethics Consultation Support
- b) Production of Public Education Materials on bioethics
- c) Community outreach programs
- 4. Bioethics Institutional Sustainability

The last area aims to strengthen Bioethics institution to ensure robust and sustainable Bioethics growth in Indonesia and the Asia Pacific region through:

- a) Capacity building activities
- b) Revitalising Indonesian bioethics community

In general, the team managed to execute most of the proposed programmes. One major shortcoming that we have identified revolves around the financial and technical adjustments that we had to make due to the worsening situation of the COVID-19, impacting the way the university operated, including in dispensing the allocated budget for the project. This led to the delay of some of the programmes. However, the Chair is committed to continue these programmes into completion in 2022.

2. Activities

a) Education/Training/Research

Education

1. Raboan (Weekly Scientific Discussion)

By collaborating with the Bioethics Master Programme at Universitas Gadjah Mada and the Center for Bioethics and Medical Humanities, the Chair organise a weekly scientific discussion – known widely as 'Raboan' as it has always been conducted on Wednesdays – which features experts and academics in bioethics and humanities. The speakers consisted of academics and practitioners with different backgrounds and disciplines, enriching the sphere of discussion during the session. Before the pandemic, the discussions were held in person, but now that the sessions were fully online through Zoom meetings, more people were able to join. The Chair did not only feature local and national experts but also internationally-acclaimed speakers, such as:




2. Massive Open Online Course

In accordance with the Merdeka Belajar Kampus Merdeka initiatives by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Research and Technology, the Chair endeavoured to disperse widely accessible bioethics education materials through Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs). The MOOCs are designed to fit with UGM's e-learning platform, "eLok" and curated to suit the needs of prospective learners in regards to bioethics.

One MOOC entitled "Striving for Perfection: Exploring Human Enhancement Technology" has been finished and integrated into the eLok platform. This MOOC was adapted from the previous elective module and covers topics related to the ethical foundations of the utilisation of Human Enhancement Technology and its contextual features, such as:

- 1. Human Enhancement Technology in Reproductive Science & Technology
- 2. Technology in Cosmetic, Gender, and Sexual Enhancement
- 3. Human Enhancement Technology in The Context of Nanotechnology & Neurology
- 4. Human Enhancement Technology in The Context of Drug Enhancement and Personalized Medicine
- 5. Complex Ethical Dimensions Surrounding Human Enhancement Technology
- 6. What Falls Under Eugenics, Therapy, Normalcy and Abnormalcy?
- 7. Factors Affecting The Development of Human Enhancement Technology
- 8. Implications of Human Enhancement Technology to Human Identity and Community
- 9. Implications of Human Enhancement Technology to Future Health System
- 10. Improving Ethical Skills & Critical Thinking to Evaluate Human Enhancement Technology

3. Module Development

Module for An Elective in Human Enhancement Technology
 This module was originally developed in 2017 and organised as an elective class for undergraduate medical students. The module was then further refined and copyrighted/patented. We aim to produce more modules for the coming years and are in the middle of compiling all the relevant materials.

Training

Initially, we had a plan to conduct ETTC online, but we're still coordinating with the UNESCO HQ & Jakarta Office in terms of the most feasible delivery mode during the pandemic. In the upcoming years, we also endeavour to advance internal capacity building for faculty members.

Research

The research under the UNESCO Chair project facilitates the research undertaken by the faculty members of the Center for Bioethics and Medical Humanities specifically in the topics surrounding bioethics assessment and notable challenges in ethical clearance applications for research. There is also a research plan in development on the initiation of national bioethics curriculum database, which can hopefully commence in the following years.

Community Service

- Initiating Ethics Consultation Service

As one of the leading focal points of bioethics in the country nested within an esteemed university, community service is also part of our core business aside from education and research. The initiative to enact an ethics consultation service for the public is our endeavour to provide assistance in solving ethical problems that is widely accessible. For the time being, the service is still limited to ethical problems within the corridor of healthcare/health sciences. This support is provided by a team of experts who have training and experience in humanities, ethics, legal and professional aspects of inpatient care. Health care professionals (including physicians, nurses, midwives, and public health experts), residents, hospital ethics committee members, and medical school teachers are welcome to request this consultation support. Any ethical dilemmas are important to be resolved to overcome distress and maintain the "moral fitness" of the healthcare professionals. Below are some topics which prompt requests for ethics consultation:

• Concerns associated with end-of-life treatments (code status, advance directives, withholding/withdrawal of medical interventions, etc)

- · Questions regarding surrogate decision-making
- · Patient refusal of treatment
- Inter-collegial or interdisciplinary conflicts: conflicts between physicians, nurses, hospital managerial, etc.
- Permissibility of using innovative or controversial treatments
- Scare resource allocation

A promotional video and poster have also been created to help advertise the service.

b) Conferences/Meetings

 Meetings – International Webinar in Commemoration of the 20th Anniversary of the Center for Bioethics and Medical Humanities Celebrating the 20 long years since the Center for Bioethics and Medical Humanities was founded, we held an international half-day online seminar during which we introduced our Chair on Bioethics and floored our aims and commitments.

e) Cooperation with UNESCO Headquarters, Field Offices

In this period, we have had close contact with UNESCO Jakarta through video conference meetings, especially prior to the commencement and early period of the project. In addition, we have also gained support from the acting Ambassador of Indonesia for UNESCO, Prof Ismunandar, PhD.



2. Future Plans and Development Prospects

There are programmes that we are to continue in the following period in accordance to areas previously mentioned, namely Bioethics in Higher Education, Bioethics in Community, Bioethics for Institutional Sustainability, and Bioethics Research.

1. Bioethics in Higher Education

Aiming to strengthen health-related bioethics education, our plan for the proposed programmes are as follows:

- i) Scientific discussion that has already been taking place on a weekly basis named Raboan, is to be done in four different segments per month, i.e. Expert Dialogue segment, Research Dissemination segment, one segment that involves students in the discussion, and one segment that is carried in collaboration with Indonesian Medical Association.
- ii) Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) that comprises of four topics is to be executed in the following months: 1) Ethical Reflections on COVID-19 in March-May, 2) Green Health Care in May-July, 3) Digital Age Doctor in September-December, and 4) Human Enhancement Technology in July-August.
- iii) Two HELP (Humanity-Ethics-Legal-Professionalism) modules are targeted to be completed in October. Module materials are taken from HELP Online Course conducted regularly in series by CBMH which in recent years collaborated with our chair.

Furthermore, we are also planning activities intended for non-health related disciplines, which are listed below:

- A meeting with Vice Deans from other faculties in UGM to discuss issues surrounding teaching and learning process in higher education these days is framed in between March to May.
- ii) Ethics Teachers Training Course (ETTC) is to be coordinated in further with UNESCO Jakarta.

We also aim to internationalise our Bioethics Master Program by having visiting Professors in our curriculum, one professor to be scheduled in each odd and even semester.

2. Bioethics in Community

Programmes proposed in this area are as follows:

- Advancing Bioethics Consultation Service by proactively conducting meetings with Hospital Ethics Committees to discuss ethical challenges commonly encountered in hospitals or healthcare. Identifying experts to be part of the consultation service is also needed in the near future.
- ii) Collaborating with related existing organisations, we plan to make an event themed "Bioethics in action for population with special needs" around July to August.
- iii) Utilising our recurring discussion forum, Raboan, for community education, we publicise said forum through accessible information and discussion platforms in the form of videos and report articles for every topic or session weekly.
- Releasing Bioethics Policy Briefs on current trending bioethics issues, aiming for five policy briefs per year. For that purpose, training on policy brief writing is needed and to be organised sometime in June. Joint training with other study centres is also possible.
- 3. Bioethics for Institutional Sustainability

In this area, below are our propositions:

- Capacity building for faculty members by sending one or two members to attend training for ethics consultant and conferences. Trainings expected to be attended are those by University of Wollongong, Loyola University Chicago, or National University of Singapore.
- Organising a national conference on the following choice of themes to be determined later: COVID-19, Big Data, Artificial Intelligence, or Bioethics as a Way of Life.

4. Bioethics Research

There are two research schemes that we target to be done in the next year, each resulting in one draft manuscript or report: 1) qualitative systematic review on bioethics
